Overview

This appendix provides additional results from the public and municipal surveys discussed in the Public and Municipal Perspectives Report.

Municipal Survey Respondent Details


Those who responded to the survey can be broken down as follows:

- 139 total responses representing 50 municipalities and 1 county (20 New Hampshire, 30 Vermont, 1 New Hampshire County)
- 85 (62%) officials from smaller communities with under 3,000 population, 48 (35%) from larger communities with over 3,000 population
- 45 (32%) planning board and commission members
- 16 (12%) select board members
- 16 (12%) town planners and zoning administrators
- Other respondents included town managers/administrators, zoning board members, listers and additional municipal officials and committee members




Figure 2. Residents indicate whether they had sufficient options when looking for their current home.




Figure 3. Renters indicate whether they would prefer to rent or own in 5 years' time.




Figure 4. Renters indicate why they do not currently own a home.




Figure 5. Municipal officials identify what they believe to be the primary reason for the lack of affordable and accessible housing in their community.




Figure 6. Seniors (or soon to be) share what kind of home they would look for if they moved.




Figure 7. Residents identify those priority items if they were to move to a new home.




Figure 8. Residents share their commuting patterns to work or school.
